#### Kia ora Parents and Whanau

Thank you all for having students at home on Monday so our staff could engage in the New Zealand Curriculum refresh. This is a significant document for our kura to engage with.

Te Mātaiaho, which means "to observe and examine the strands of learning" will be in place during term 3 2023. As a staff, we have unpacked what will impact on teaching and learning. Some key points for you as parents is that this curriculum will have

- a Vision for Young People written by young people for young people
- a purpose statement to ensure equity and inclusion for all ākonga.

Mātauranga Māori will sit at the heart of the learning areas, with key competencies, literacy, and numeracy explicitly woven into each learning area.

Over the next two terms, you will have more opportunities to come and see how teachers will be providing students with learning. We will be providing more information on our Structured Literacy approaches and working with you on how together we can assist all learners to achieve. We will also be providing opportunities to see student progress through the use of HERO. Students and teachers will be adding to their portfolio of learning for you to see progress in a range of areas. This will form part of our reporting and, in time, this will be ongoing throughout each term and not the traditional Mid and End of Year report.

As part of our day, we had the expertise of Kate Nitschke share with our team effective ways to manage well being. While we are working with our tamariki on mindfulness it is important that as a staff, we too can model this to our tamariki. We are constantly working on how we manage our well being which in turn has an impact on the tamariki.



#### JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

The 150th Jubilee is this Saturday 29 April. All tamariki are expected to be at school to participate in this celebration from 11:00am to 4:00pm. Students can wear tidy mufti for the celebration.


**Stone Cairn:** We are inviting families attending to contribute toward the building of a small stone cairn to commemorate the gathering of 2023.

What is a cairn? The word originates from the Scottish Gaelic: càrn. Cairns are a mound of rough stones built as a memorial or landmark, typically on a hill top or skyline. These man-made structures have been and are used for a broad variety of purposes, from prehistoric times to the present. Each rock can signify an intention of grace for thankfulness.

The invitation is for each family to 'supply' as in 'bring along' a stone to make up the small cairn. Please follow the recommended dimensions of a maximum 30cm length by 15cm wide by 15cm high. Make your family stone identifiable by writing your family name on a strip of masking tape attached to your stone. We will have a tarpaulin laid out at the Jubilee where you can leave your stone.


