Over the last two weeks we have been challenged by sickness going through our kura. Not only are students being sick, it is also transferring to our staff. We are endeavouring to have teachers in each class each day and I think we are doing a very good job at this; from what I am hearing in other schools, where they are asking students to stay at home or in some cases having to close schools due to lack of teachers. While I know it is really frustrating for those of you that work and have sick children, it is a thankless job for Whaea Kerry having to manage the sick bay and contacting parents to collect sick children. It makes it really difficult when the sickness is transferred to not only other tamariki, but also our staff. If you have a sick child please keep them at home to support our whole school.

Structured Literacy/ HERO: Last Thursday evening we had a great evening session in the three junior classes on structured literacy along with providing information about using HERO for reporting. If you cannot access HERO we need you to call into the office so we can set up your account to receive information and, in time, reports on student achievement. Thanks to those parents who took up the opportunity to upskill on how our team are supporting learners using structured literacy. It is different to how we learnt when we went to school so it is great to have our whanau engaged in how the literacy learning takes place in classes can be supported at home. In the future we will also provide an evening with the senior school teachers on how this will look in Years 4 to 8.

We have sent out a help sheets on using HERO when reports start coming to you directly via email or when you log into the HERO app.

Increasing Teacher Capabilities: Over recent weeks our staff have been immersed in upskilling, moderating and establishing clear ways to communicate how our tamariki are achieving in relation to the New Zealand curriculum levels. This, in fact, has been happening all year and I want to acknowledge our staff for actively upskilling themselves constantly. We have teachers engaged in upskilling in Mathematics practices and familiarising themselves with the new Maths curriculum document, and sharing practice with other teachers from a range of schools around the Rangitikei and Manawatu. We have staff regularly attending Structured Literacy sessions where experts are sharing best practice along with helpful teaching hints. As teachers we are always learning and we are always looking for how we can improve our teaching to meet the needs of the tamariki of today. I enjoy getting into classes and seeing the learning happen with kaiako taking groups on specific learning tasks and seeing students participating in follow up activities either independently or with Teacher Aide support. Our class environments allow all this rich learning to happen and are in impeccable condition, where students have space to move around and learn.

Seniors taking on Leadership: Each week we have a group of senior students taking on leadership roles around the school. This is a great opportunity for them to be contributors to our kura. We have weekly sport activities/games organised at lunch-times which can range from dodgeball, tails tag, capture the flag through to practicing basketball skills. This has been supported through Sport Whanganui upskilling our seniors to develop leadership. It is impressive watching and hearing the students being able to organise and be the referee constructively.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, a group of students are managing breakfast (Weetbix and milk) for those students that would like some. This happens from 8:00am until 8:25am in the Media Centre and on Wednesdays, a group is organising Milos on the deck at the same time. This is nearly turning into a cafe opportunity! The school library is open every day with student librarians making the space available with not only books but games, puzzles and colouring for those that want a quiet space. It is brilliant seeing the students take ownership of the library and creating an environment for others to enjoy. The librarians have set a timetable of activities to occur each day. This week has seen a Lego challenge, colouring competitions and I know there will be some guizzes in the future.

#### SCHOOL NOTICES

School buses: When you're passing a school bus that's stopped to let kids on or off, the speed limit is 20km/h. This limit applies even if the school bus has stopped on the opposite side of the road to where you are driving. Our bus drivers have noticed that most drivers don't slow down at all. There are also things that you can teach your children around bus safety. The NZTA advise:

If you pick up or drop off your children at the bus stop:

- wait on the same side of the road as the bus stop
- park your car well away from the bus stop or other children
- teach your children about safe bus behaviour

   and practice it with them
- encourage your children to wait quietly at the stop and to keep away from the road.

If your children make their own way to or from the bus stop:

- teach your child the safest route from their house to the bus stop the route with the fewest road crossings and least traffic
- if they have to cross the road after getting off the bus, teach them to wait until the bus has moved away and they can see up and down the road clearly
- dress them in brightly coloured or reflectorised clothing that can be easily seen by drivers.


