What a difference some fine weather makes! It amazes me how many events we have crammed into this term and the exposure to a range of learning is amazing for our tamariki.

Last week we had a magnificent book character day with a huge variety of characters arriving at school. It was impressive hearing the range of speeches related to characters from each class, and the confidence of our tamariki to present in front of the school was inspiring. We loved sharing this day with so many of our community, and

that the environment around our kura celebrating books was so positive. This highlighted how important it is for everyone to enjoy reading. Proceeds of books bought through the Scholastic book fair will provide more books for our school library and class reading resources. Thank you to everyone who bought books.

Room 5, 6 and 1 attended the Science Roadshow last week, where students got to work on practical hands-on experiments, or were guided through experiments by expert science teachers. This has sparked some ideas on what more science opportunities we could offer, including using local

resources to continue enabling this curriculum area to grow in our kura.

Rangitikei Tough Kids last Friday saw 60 Year 3 to 8 students participating in both the competitive and fun events. We again had students wanting to make the day even more enjoyable by dressing up. We also had some great achievements with Harry O'Neill coming first in the Year 4 boys race and Leah Maas placing second in the Year 6 girls. As we had such good representation in each year group, many of our students placed in the top 10 or 20 of their respective age groups. Again, without the massive support from parents this would not have been possible. It was great to see Shanae Jones and Libby Rayner out showing the tamariki that they too were prepared to be tough kids by completing the course!

Our Arts Showcase at Te Matapihi has been postponed until 13 September 2023. This will be a whole school celebration of the arts which is part of our triannual arts curriculum focus. This is our way of ensuring that we cover the arts curriculum with effect to all aspects of the arts. With the volume of events going on this term we want to make sure all classes are well prepared for this showcase and appreciate the extra time to fine-tune performances.

We have seen three of our students excel in piano exams with Dyllan Nairne, Oscar and Milton Auret receiving awards. We really love where the extension music option is going, and this is a great opportunity for parents to choose for students to be involved. It is evident that our tamariki enjoy having the time to have these lessons during the regular school day.



We would like to celebrate some success for one of our former pupils and their family. Last week, Hugh Thomas was announced as Head Boy at Feiding High School. Hugh finished his Year 8 at South Makirikiri School in 2019. During Hugh's time at South Makirikiri he competed in a range of sports, academic challenges like Lit Quiz and Mathex, and is a fine example of the quality pupils that come from our wonderful kura. We are very proud to see Hugh's achievements and also the connection we still have with the Thomas whanau with Ella currently in Year 7 with

us. We know there are many more examples of students from South Makirikiri School succeeding from the foundation skills they received through not only school, but home as well, and it is nice to celebrate these successes.

#### BACON AND BAKED BEAN MUFFINS

Serves 12 - Prep time 15 minutes - Cooking time - 15 minutes

Great savoury muffin recipe for the whole family to enjoy!

#### INGREDIENTS

1 medium onion, peeled and finely chopped

- 3-4 rashers bacon, diced
- 3 cups self-raising flour
- 2 tsp dry mustard

- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp each salt and pepper
- 2-3 Tbsp chopped fresh parsley
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups grated cheese
- 420g can Wattie's baked beans

2 eggs

- 1 ¼ cups milk
- 100g melted butter

#### METHOD

Cook the onion and bacon in a dash of oil in a frying pan until softened and cooked. Cool.

Sift the self-rising flour, mustard, salt and pepper into a large bowl. Stir in the parsley and one cup of grated cheese. Make a well in the centre.

Mix the onion mixture, Watties baked beans, eggs and milk together and pour into the dry ingredients. Stir gently to mix, adding the melted butter as you stir. Do not over-mix as the muffins will peak.

Divide the mixture evenly among 12 well-greased muffin tins and sprinkle the tops with a little of the remaining grated cheese.

Bake at 220 degrees Celsius for 15 minutes until well risen and golden. Cool in tins for two to three minutes before transferring to a cake rack.
