Kia ora koutou, whanau

It has been a pleasure this week to have our tamariki fully immersed in learning for a complete week. We have welcomed many new whanau and tamariki, and it is so amazing seeing the way new students are supported and welcomed by their peers. As you walk around our kura (as I have done in the past few weeks with visitors and new whanau) it is evident that our staff have settled students into engaging learning programmes. Our staff is very focused on the urgency of seeing students progress. All teachers have been sending home notices about what is happening in each of their spaces, expectations for homework and how you can support the learning that happens in class. We invite all parents to make contact with teachers if they need any clarification about what will be happening in each class. We have also purchased extensive resources to support reading, and send home readers to support students to practice what they have learnt in reading sessions. Please ensure these resources come back each day.

As you will have seen in the first notice last week, our term is already very busy, and I know many classes and teams have more events planned, so please keep checking the school website where the calendar of events will be updated regularly.

It is exciting that we have 37 students in Years 3 to 8 registered for the Mt Biggs Tough Kids which runs on Friday 22 March. More details for those registered will come out in due course.

Many local sporting opportunities are available during term 1, and we will continue to advertise these via Facebook and/or our newsletter. We welcome parents who are keen to facilitate teams and enable as many South Makirikiri students to participate as possible. Please make contact if you can help with any of the sports. This term, cricket will be a big focus, with South Mak support the Marton Saracens Club with their teams.

Starting this week, builders will be onsite doing remedial work on Room 7 which may cause some congestion around the pick-up and drop-zone at the start and end of each day. This has been a long-term project to get the MOE to recognise there is a fault and to finally see work starting is exciting. Please note that we have huge numbers of vehicles coming in at each end of the school day. We encourage parents to model using the walkway and crossing zone in the centre of the car park with students. We understand the dental caravan causes extra congestion and do not want to see students walking across the car park to meet parents.

To make this tuition work, students will be given time slots that may impact on some group or personalised teaching and learning sessions. This is a wonderful opportunity for students to expand their knowledge in other curriculum areas. Music tuition classes are now full, and students wanting to join will go on a waiting list.
