Goals:

Maths: Making significant progress of students in Year 6 and 7 in 2024. Moving 5 of the 11 students to AT by the end of the year.

In Year 4 the target will be to reduce the number of Below students by at least 50% Moving 4 of 7 students to AT by the end of the year.

Writing: Year 3, 4 and 5 In 2024 the focus will be to reduce the number of students Below the desired curriculum level by 50% moving 8 of the 16 students to AT.

Reading: Moving 3 of the 5 students in Year 3 from Below to AT.

In Year 5 to move at least 25% of students achieving At the desired curriculum level to above. Increase the number of students achieving ABOVE the desired curriculum level in 2024. From a strong base of
