Evolving Our Reporting: A New Approach to Student Achievement

On Friday at some stage mid-year report general comments and achievement in Reading, Writing and Maths will become live on HERO. This is our first time reporting against the revised MOE curriculum levels. We know that this change can result in a change to their current level of achievement. Below is an explanation from the MOE on this shift.

Statement from the Ministry of Education to Support Schools with Reporting to Parents



As part of our focus on lifting student achievement we have introduced new, knowledge-rich and internationally-comparable curriculum this year for Maths in Years 0-8 and English in Years 0-6, and Te Reo Rangatira Years 0-6 and Pāngarau Years 0-8 wāhanga ako.

This means we are currently changing from the old to the new curriculum. We want to acknowledge that schools and kura will only have been using the new curricula from the start of 2025, which includes new teaching and assessment methods and content.

Because of this you could see a change in your child's progress or achievement compared to previous years which may be the result of changes in the curriculum expectations for your child's year level. If you have concerns or questions about your child's achievement, we strongly suggest you talk with your child's teacher or kaiako. They will also have used their own observations, classroom tasks and other tests to report on the progress your child is making.

The primary shift in this new reporting approach is moving away from traditional, broad 'levels of achievement' towards a more detailed reflection of your child's progress against specific curriculum phases and their capabilities. This means:

- **Deeper Insights:** You will receive more specific feedback on what your child can do, what they are working towards, and how they are progressing in relation to the curriculum's learning intentions.
- **Focus on Progression:** The reports will emphasize the progress your child is making over time, highlighting their individual learning pathway rather than solely comparing them to a fixed benchmark.
- **Holistic View:** The new format aims to provide a more holistic view of your child's development, including their key competencies and values, in addition to academic learning.

We believe this new reporting style will offer more meaningful insights, empowering you to better support your child's learning at home and fostering a deeper understanding of their educational journey. We will provide further information and examples of the new report format next term and this will also be great to talk with class teachers with the upcoming parent conferences that will be available to book on HERO. The dates for these conversations are Tuesday the 15th and Wednesday the 16th of July.

Coffee Connect for parents:

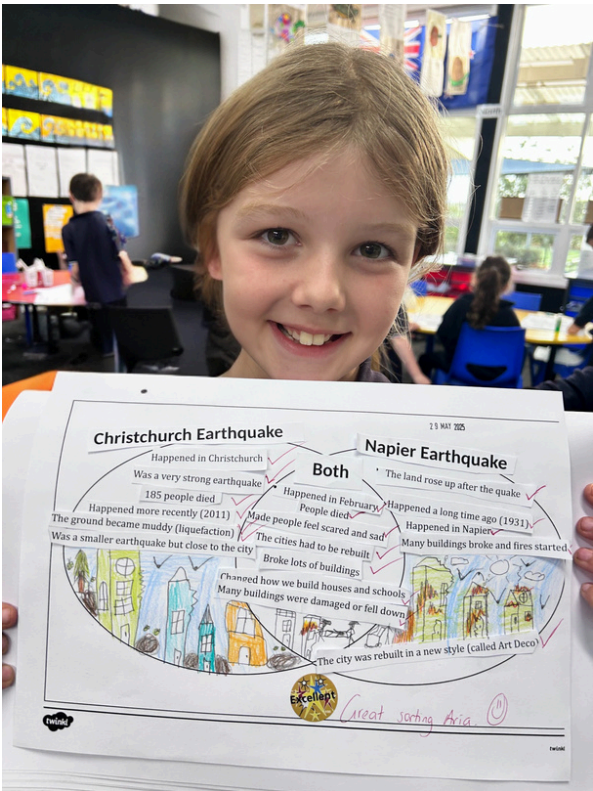
